Please make sure students are dressed appropriately for the weather - including winter coats, hats, gloves, raincoats and umbrellas. Write your child's name on all items in permanent marker.

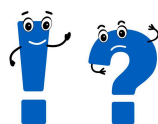

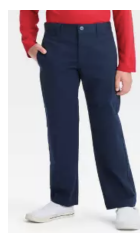


Global Citizen of the Week
